

Religious Education Update for April

Living the Golden Rule

Daily Reflections for Lent by Daniel P. Horan

Readings: Esth C:12, 14-16, 23-25; Matt 7:7-12

Scripture: "Do to others whatever you would have them do to you. This is the law and the prophets." (Matt 7:12)

Reflection: The Golden Rule is recognized as a universal exhortation that transcends religion, culture, and time. Ancient religious and philosophical traditions, share the belief Jesus expresses at the end of today's Gospel: "Do to others whatever you would have them do you you." So, if virtually every human community has asserted this for as long as we have written records, then why is it something we are so bad at doing?

The answer partly rest in our shared human tendency toward selfishness. Self-care and preservation are not, in themselves, bad instincts. Think, for example, of a flight attendants' instructions to "put on your own oxygen mask before helping others." or the motto "You cannot give what you do not have." We must take care of ourselves in some basic ways in order to help others.

The problem arises when we attend to our needs without ever helping others with their "oxygen mask"-or without giving them the physical, emotional, or spiritual support they need. With his instruction to "ask and be given", seek and find", "knock and be opened," Jesus is reminding us that love, help, and mercy are always readily available from God. Jesus frequently reminds us that our call is to be more like God in our words and deeds. When we ask something of God, God always provides, but when others need something from us, we often ignore. Perhaps the Golden Rule, then, is just a shorthand reminder to be more Godlike in our outlook and behavior.

Meditation: Jesus refers to the generosity parents naturally show their children. This is a reminder that most people are not absolutely selfish, but that we are often generous only to those closest to us. Are there ways I can expand my circle of generosity to live out the Golden Rule in my own life?

Prayer: God of all grace, you give me everything I need and do not shy away from giving me more when I ask. Help me be more like you in the way I treat everyone I encounter, both familiar and the stranger, those I like and those I struggle to appreciate.
