Parish Infrastructure Renovation 2018-2024

Presentation by Jim Hagenbarth

2017-18 - Father Pascal organized Parish Joint Committee meetings to identify and prioritize short and long term infrastructural needs of the Parish Complex along with appropriate staffing to address these spiritual and administrative needs. -Several short term needs addressed for the church, rectory, family center and Melrose with an expenditure of \$49,000 +.

-The long term projects identified and prioritized were: For the church a bathroom and relocation of the baptismal font; for the parish center- storage, kitchen remodel, main room refurbishing including chairs and tables; and the Melrose Church needed a roof replacement.

- A Capital Campaign Committee was formed to secure funding and coordinate the projects, but with Covid the Bishop nixed capital projects. This committee was renamed the Renovation Committee and was designed to work on smaller projects as funding permitted.

2019 –22- Father Jason pursued the Melrose Church, Church Bathroom and proposed kitchen projects and instituted placing Renovation Fund envelopes in our packets and at the back of the church to help raise funds. An August hail storm damaged the Church and rectory roofs. Claims were filed and only the church roof was covered. B Carroll Construction replaced the church roof, facia, and soffits for a total cost of \$178,000 with all but \$38,000 covered by insurance. Ben Carroll did a great job negotiating with the insurance company and saved us a lot of money. Aaron Weinacht replaced all the screws in the rectory roof and resealed all the jacks to give it an extended life. Aaron also build frame screens to keep the pigeons out of the bell towers.

2022-2024- Father Lively continued with the Renovation Committee's Plan. Committee members, along with Donna Jones and Jerad Payne from Bridger Creek Construction, designed the bathroom plans and construction began with the final project costing \$34,000. Committee members along with Jennifer McKay, Ann Egan and Jared Payne worked with various independent contractors to begin the remodel of the kitchen and parish hall. Ann Egan, Danna Harrison, Pam Scott, Barbie Judge did a lot of cleaning, demolition, consulting, and planning throughout the project, working with Jerad Payne and the independent contractors ensuring quality of work and proper scheduling. This project is complete with no short cuts taken and will enhance the needs of the Parish and the community into the future. The final cost of the Kitchen and Main Hall in the Parish center was \$212,000. This concluded Phase I of the Renovation Plan authorized by the Bishop for St. Rose.

During this time frame Jared Potter Construction of Dillon completed the renovation of the Melrose Church for a cost of \$51,000 which included reinforcing the old roof, installing a new metal roof, pouring a retaining cap around the foundation, incorporating 4 metal rods to reinforce the walls, re-grouting and sealing the outside stone walls and painting the outside of the church that was wood.

Approximate expenditures to date: St Rose - \$333,000 Melrose- \$51,000

The Renovation Committee is remindful that the heating unit above the stage in the Parish Center needs eventual replacement along with the boiler in the church basement. These two items have an estimated replacement cost that ranges from \$61,000 to \$100,000 with no upgrades to the boiler system in the church.

The Renovation Committee is now starting Phase II of the long term plan which includes: renovation of the choir loft, enlarging the confessional which makes more room for the Shrine to Our Lady of Guadalupe, and moving the baptismal font, holy oils and pastoral candle to the back of the church. This will entail moving pews from the back to the front of the church to make room. Donna Jones has drawn up plans and Jerad Payne of Bridger Creek Construction will develop a budget and bid. The Bishop will not approve Phase II until we raise the necessary funds. Additional projects being considered for the church are: new flooring and/or carpeting, refinishing the pews, and resurfacing the kneelers and this will be accommodated in Phase II, but not included. We are especially thankful for the financial support given considering your other obligations to the Diocese, St. Rose, our families and community. Rupert Murdoch's support along with other large anonymous donations are acknowledged. We especially recognize the Hispanic contributions to the placement and design of the Shrine to Our Lady. Elva Gonzalez and Angelica Guillen personally attended meetings supporting our efforts and making positive suggestions for the Shrine design. They presented us with a significant cash contribution from the Hispanic members of our faith community.

All the Parishioners of St Rose have participated in these renovation projects either through manual, financial, moral or spiritual support. The Renovation Committee is working for you and we are so grateful for your support. We ask that you personally contact us with your concerns and suggestions. Father Pascal, Jason and Lively along with the Pastoral Council, Finance Council, User Fee Committee, Funeral Committee, Knights of Columbus, Bargain Basement ,business office, and many individuals are all responsible for these accomplishments as a living faith community. We ask for your continued support and thank you in the Name of Christ. May God Bless Each and Every One of You.


